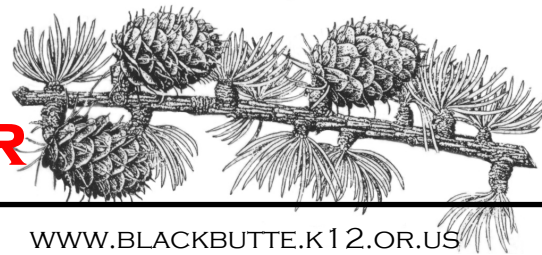

New Curriculum Highlights Field Studies Program

With many new staff members, and the support of OSU Cascades, BBS is excited to launch a new curriculum that will facilitate learning directly from our environment and human community here in Central Oregon. Our cornerstone field studies program will allow students to bring together their knowledge from core subjects and apply it to real-world projects. These projects will include science experiments, social studies projects, visits from local experts, collaborations with local agencies, and field expeditions. Field expeditions will take place on full days peppered throughout the school year. We are looking forward to one of our first expeditions where we will camp out along our favorite river, the Metolius. The field studies program will rotate on a four-year schedule of thematic concentrations. This year's themes are forestry, water, farming, and food, which will help students to grasp the interconnectedness between human and non-human communities. Mr. Sharp is excited to bring his 10+ years of environmental education experience to BBS to lead the field studies program.

Our core subjects are the foundations for our field studies program. Each morning, students will break into age groups for focused time spent on language arts, math, science, and social studies. Our very own talented Mr. B will be teaching language arts and social studies, as well as supporting our field studies programs. Our newest and most experienced staff member, Ms. Craig, will be teaching STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math).

Enrichment classes will round off our curriculum and engage BBS students in expanding their creativity, foreign language skills, and physical strength and agility. Enrichment classes planned for this year are: PE (including ski and swim programs), introductory Spanish, health, drama, music, and visual arts. We may add a couple more enrichment classes in the spring.
