America's Rich History by Adrian (grade 7)

There have been many things that have happened in America's rich history. It was not always pretty, but our country had a start. At BBS, the older students have been learning about our interesting history.

Here is some of what we learned about. Ancient people traveled across a land bridge between Russia and Alaska, becoming the first native Americans. But when the land was covered with the rapidly raising water level, it disconnected America from the rest of the world. In 1492 Columbus accidentally landed in the Caribbean, thinking he was in Asia. Unknown to him and his crew, this discovery changed the world forever. He told the royals who employed him that there was tons of gold, then enslaved the natives of the islands. Other explorers followed him. Some time later, Britain sent over some settlers and others such as the puritans ran away to this land so they could freely practice their religions. The French had colonies too. Then France and England fought in the French Indian War. Britain won and expanded territory to the South. Cash crops were planted in the South, using slaves to do most of the work. Slavery was complicated and might offend some people, but the upper graders of BBS learned about slavery and some of its history in our country.
